Why a Capacity Self-Assessment Tool?



Compliance review processes are essential to ensuring the achievement of RFMO objectives



RFMO compliance review processes are labor intensive and can be demanding on members



Lack of capacity is often cited as a barrier to compliance



Many RFMOs have initiatives to support members with capacity challenges

Purpose of the Capacity Self-Assessment Tool?



To help States **identify the specific challenges** that prevent their full and effective engagement in compliance review processes and **prepare for taking action** to address these challenges.



Is beneficial for **auditing** and **enhancing systems**, tools, and processes for engaging in RFMO compliance assessment processes.




Who is the Capacity Self-Assessment Tool for?








Outcomes


