Overall Workshop Objectives: Identify challenges in compliance review mechanisms and suggest solutions for addressing these challenges, building on ongoing work to analyze and support improved RFMO compliance mechanisms.

First Workshop (September 2020): Information management and reporting; compliance review and assessment procedures; outcomes of compliance review and assessment procedures.

Second Workshop (March 2021): The role of transparency in improving RFMO compliance.

Third Workshop (November 2021): Outcomes of compliance review processes, particularly RFMO responses to situations of non-compliance.

Attendees and Format


A special focus was placed on tuna RFMOs, although experts with experience in non-tuna RFMOs also participated

All conducted under Chatham House Rule.


Vital to ensure candid contributions around identifying problems and proposing solutions





Some of the challenges and solutions discussed:

- Complexity/ambiguity of measures
- Large volumes of data/reporting requirements
- Capacity building needs
- Lack of trust
- Gaps in documentation/access to information
- Lack of follow-up/responses to serious noncompliance
