





# Compliance review procedures:

Compliance review procedures:

Responsibility of the Compliance Committee (CoC) – Appendix V of the IOTC Rules of Procedure

- Develop and circulate Compliance Questionnaire (4 months to CoC)
- Develop and circulate template for the Implementation Report (not mandatory)
- Receive and circulate Compliance Questionnaire (2 months to CoC)
- Receive Report of Implementation 60 days to CoC and post in the website
- Secretariat compile Compliance Reports (sources CQ, IR, NR, other)






## Compliance review procedures (cont'd):


- Circulate Compliance Reports (CR) to CPCs (30 days to CoC)
- Receive feedback from CPCs (over 15 days)
- Finalise CR, identify and list compliance issues (15 days to CoC)
- CR reviewed and discussed at CoC.
  - CPCs encouraged to pose questions/seek clarifications on non-compliant issues
- Letter of Feedback issued at the Commission meeting

  - Develop i-sheets
  - Develop Implementation Manuals
  - Develop templates for the Implementation Report (IR)
  - Develop Reporting templates
  - Develop an IOTC Legal Framework
  - Transposition of decisions of the Commission in the National Law
