CASES OF POSSIBLE NON-COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR VESSELS DESCRIBED IN ANNEX VIII OF THE AIDCP, AND OCCURRED SINCE THE 66TH MEETING

During this period, the Secretariat has reviewed a total of 1443 fishing trips. Of these, we have 12 trips with cases of possible non-compliance that the IRP automatically identifies; that is, the IRP has instructed the Secretariat to forward them to the Parties after each meeting. In addition, we have nine cases of possible non-compliance that the IRP routinely analyzes and gives guidelines to the Secretary during its meeting; and this last group will be presented to the IRP until its 68th meeting, due to limited time in the 67th meeting. Details below:
